The auction starts with a small selection of **Marklin HO-gauge**, including our featured item the much sought-after articulated passenger set. There's also a bit of **Tri-ang** and some more of the modern **Hornby OO-gauge** sets and locomotives – again, most of these are like new and many have DCC and sound fitted.

There's a great range of **Australian trains**, notably the HO-gauge brass locomotives, the Ferris O-gauge Red Rattlers, and the O-gauge track and spare parts. There are also a few prints by Australian artists Kenneth Bowen and Brian Baigent.

After that we have another offering of **live steam**, including engines, vehicles, accessories, and Mamod steam trains.

Meccano is back this month with sets, parts and magazines, including a superb collection of original parts which have clearly never been used. Most of them are like new and many are still sealed in their packets.

Then there are plenty of cars. There's a large range **1:18 scale cars** from Maisto, Auto Art, Welly and other brands, including lots of Shelby racing cars.

There's a huge selection of modern **Corgi vehicles** including cars, trucks and buses. Also a good many **Matchbox 1-75s** both early and modern, and some Yesteryears.

No ships or planes this time, but a great auction for those who love trains, cars, steam, and construction sets.
