This time it's trains, trains, and more trains! Lots of locomotives, rolling stock, accessories, track, sets, kits, parts, books and DVDs.

Our featured item, "Joe Cool" Snoopy, is one of several LGB Peanuts 1-gauge items. These were released only briefly some years ago and are not easy to get. We have just a small selection in this auction, so if you need any of them (of course you do), get in quick because there's a lot of interest in them already.

Another very special item is Lot 159, the Melbourne Connex Nexus Car. This is a large, static display model built by the manufacturer, Siemens, as a sales sample to promote this train to the Victorian Government. Melbourne now has a fleet of them, but the model made its way to New South Wales, and finally to us, and we'd like to find a loving home for it, perhaps back in Victoria.

Back to the running models... as well as a selection of 1-gauge, this auction has a great range of O-gauge and HO/OO-gauge, also a good number of N-gauge items, and a little bit of Lone Star OOO-gauge.

There are also a few toy trains, notably the Dinky pre-war sets, which are much sought-after and quite rare.

So this auction is a real treat for the train lovers. But don't fret, car enthusiasts! We're going to hold an extra auction this month featuring cars and no trains (more details below). We

think we've got everyone covered this month.

The train auction starts at 6:00pm next Monday, September 6th.
