We do not yet have details of the new rules, so we have decided not to open our Auction Rooms to the public during the auction. So once again (perhaps for the last time) it will be absentee and online bidding only.

Even so, it's going to be a good auction, with the usual great selection of cars and trains, and this month also ships.

In cars we have lots of Minic including clockwork and "Push & Go" models; a good range of Corgi including buses and "Pickfords" delivery trucks; Matchbox models of all sorts including a collection of military vehicles, and various other vehicles from many different brands.

In trains we have O-gauge, HO/OO-gauge and TT-gauge, including track, accessories and parts. We also have a very interesting collection of NSW railway signs and other memorabilia. There are also railway books, videos and framed prints.

For the maritime enthusiasts we have model ships, kits and kit plans, books and memorabilia, notably the collection of naval wall plaques.

It's an interesting mixture this month and there are some unusual items.

The auction starts at 6:00pm next Monday, October 11th. You can take part by leaving absentee bids with us, or you can watch and bid online at invaluable.com.

We will be open again for pickup of auction goods from Thursday 14th October. But if you're still not able to travel, we're happy to hold onto your goods until you can visit us.
