There's a good selection of trains in HO/OO-gauge and O-gauge, notably a fine range of Hornby O-gauge including some unusual items, also some nice Lionel pieces.

There are lots of planes of all sorts including our featured item, the Minic Comet, which is in superb condition.

In automobiles, this time we have mostly tractors, including tinplate and steel models, and several groups of Hachette diecast farm vehicles as new in sealed packaging.

We have steam again this time, including stationary steam engines, live steam vehicles, accessories and toys, also fittings and spare parts.

There is a really good range of tools for hobbyists and modellers, including tool sets, power tools, and a few unidentified items – perhaps you know what they're for!

We have a selection of mostly sci-fi novelty items, including tin toys, books, modern Batman sets, and diecast Star Trek space ships.

Meccano is also back this month, including large lots of various pieces, several sets, and clockwork & electric motors.

It's an interesting variety and we expect it to be a good auction.

There are still COVID-19 restrictions in effect, so we will not be opening our auction rooms to the public for this auction. However, we will be open for viewing this Saturday, Sunday and Monday, from 10:00am to 4:00pm each day.

The auction starts at 6:00pm next Monday, November 1st. You can take part in the auction by sending us absentee bids beforehand, or you can watch and bid live online at invaluable.com. Telephone bidding is also available by prior arrangement on lots starting at \$200 or more.
