

Auctions in 2025

For the N-gauge Modellers

We've recently been in touch with a vendor who wishes to sell a **complete N-gauge layout**. It's a beautiful layout, still set up, in a 3.5m x 3.5m C-shape.

New Auction Fees

Starting this year, we have increased our **buyer's premium** from 15% to 19.5%. This is necessary in order to continue using invaluable.com, who have changed their pricing structure so that smaller auction houses such as ours now pay higher fees. However, under the new system there is no longer an online bidding fee, so whether you bid through Invaluable or directly with us at TPA, the total fee for bidders is 19.5%, which is actually a slight discount for online bidders.

For those of you who bid online, remember that you can also leave absentee bids with us at TPA and avoid the possibility of missing out due to internet problems.
