We're ending the year with a **huge auction** that has a bit of something for everyone! As well as the usual trains, planes and automobiles, we have a some ships again, tin toys, slot cars, Lego & Meccano, NSWGR railway memorabilia, hobby tools and materials, and a donkey engine.

The selection of cars includes an impressive **1:5 scale** petrol-driven radio-controlled **Audi racing car**, hardly used and in excellent condition; also some very nice **Matchbox Superfast** vehicles, a collection of **Corgis**, a few **Dinky** military vehicles, and an interesting assortment of **slot car** items.

The selection of trains includes another offering of **Australian HO**, more of the popular Australian HO **rolling stock kits**, a rare Hornby O-gauge plastic **clockwork "Percy" set** (at least most if it), **Japanese brass O-gauge** locomotives, and a few fittings souvenired from **NSWGR trains** (not by us). The big feature is the collection of **1-gauge** locomotives, rolling stock and track, including a rare **Marklin Zeppelin** and the impressive **exhibition layout** from The Gauge One Gallery.

The small selection of ships includes the not so small **Titanic**, a modern radio-controlled model measuring 1.8 metres in length. We haven't tested it because our bath tub isn't big enough, but it appears to be in excellent condition and is superbly detailed.

And the selection of planes includes a rare find: the Australian World War II **Boomerang fighter plane**, meticulously hand-crafted from card and paper, and authentically detailed and weathered. This is a large model which would look brilliant suspended from a ceiling.

As well as all of this, we have the usual great range of trains, cars, toys, collectables and curios.

Viewing is open this Saturday, December 2nd, from 10:00am to 4:00pm at our Auction Rooms in Lawson, and on the auction day from 3:00pm, also at our Auction Rooms in Lawson.

Absentee bids can be left with us any time before the auction, and online bidding is available at invaluable.com. Telephone bidding is also available by prior arrangement.

The auction starts at 6:00pm next Monday, December 4th. Have we mentioned that the auction will take place at our new Auction Rooms in Lawson? As well as holding the first auction in our new premises, and the last auction for the year, we're celebrating our 30th anniversary and our 90th auction. All of our First Monday Toy Auctions are broadcast live online at invaluable.com, with **streaming video and audio**. But some people are having trouble seeing and hearing us, because of recent changes to the way internet browsers operate. If you're watching the auction but can't see the video window or hear the sound, you will have to tell your browser to **enable Flash**. Once Flash is enabled, the video window will be displayed, and the audio will work as well. Unfortunately, there are so many different browsers (and different versions) that we can't offer instructions on how to enable Flash in your particular browser. But the internet can be your friend, and if you do a little searching you should be able to find instructions. Our auctions are much more entertaining when you can see and hear us, so we hope you can get the video to work.

However, the boffins at **Invaluable** have been working hard on a new video system which will operate on all internet browsers, so this problem should go away very soon, and early in the new year everyone will be able to see us and hear us clearly. (If you don't think it's an improvement, you can always switch the video off again.)

No, perhaps there's no such word, but as we organise our stock at Lawson we find that we have an overabundance of books on trains, cars, ships, and all sorts of other things, and we'd like them to find new homes.
