


FIRST MONDAY TOY AUCTION FEBRUARY 1st 2016





Featured item: Lot 19 Hasbro Star Wars Naboo N-1 Starfighter with "Incredible Cross-Sections" book

Welcome to the **First Monday Toy Auction** for February, our first for 2016 – not counting our January "Quiet Auction". We're starting the year with a fantastic mix of trains, planes, cars and toys – a bit of everything, and something for everyone.

The main attraction is the Star Wars items. Our featured item is **Lot 19**, the **N-1 Starfighter** from Star Wars: Episode I, an impressive model that measures half a metre from tip to tail. This lot includes the "**Incredible Cross-Sections**" book, a large volume full of amazingly detailed pictures and specifications of the vehicles appearing in Episode I. This is an exceptional lot which will make some Star Wars collector very happy.

Other Star Wars items include vehicles, figures, Micro Machines sets, jigsaw puzzles, and a board game. Staying with the movie/TV theme, we also have items from Star Trek, Batman, X-Men, The Mask and James Bond.

Another attraction is a large selection (about 50 lots) of **aircraft**. There are model kits from **Airfix**, **Matchbox**, **Revell**, **Hasegawa**, and several other manufacturers, mostly in 1:72 scale but a few in other scales. There are also some very nice diecast aircraft from **Corgi** and **Franklin Mint**. This month we're making up for lost time and putting the Planes back into Trains, Planes & Automobiles.

But of course we also have trains and automobiles. Our selection of trains this month covers a wide variety of **locos**, **wagons**, **sets** and **accessories** from **O** all the way down to **Z**. The Z-gauge range includes a ready-to-run **portable layout** built into a wooden carry case. We have over 100 lots of **diecast cars** in various shapes and sizes, as well as a number of unusual early **plastic cars** from American and Australian manufacturers. There are also a few items to tempt the **Scalextric** fans.

But wait, there's more... the auction includes about 40 lots of **diecast soldiers** and other figures, books on toy soldiers, and military cigarette cards. Of special interest is **Lot 158**, an early **Japanese set of marching soldiers** with an aeroplane flying overhead, mounted on the original display card.

And finally a smattering of **Meccano**, including a made-up set containing hundreds of parts housed in a custom-made wooden case.

As we said, there's something for everyone. All the lots will be on display next **Saturday, January 30th**, at our **Annandale gallery**. For those of you who haven't picked up your goods from the last auction, this is the perfect opportunity to do so. As usual, we will be there from 10:00am to 4:00pm.

The auction commences at 7:00pm on Monday at our **Mount Victoria** auction venue, and everyone is welcome to attend. There's plenty of parking and refreshments are available. If you'd like to see the lots on Monday before the auction, viewing is open at the auction venue from 3:00pm.

We know that most of you can't come to the Blue Mountains on a Monday night, but you can watch the auction live at invaluable.com. Unlike our recent "quiet" auctions, we will be broadcasting **video and audio online**, so you can see and hear our toy experts giving extra information about the lots (and playing with them).

Absentee bids may be left with us prior to the auction by phone, fax, email, online or in person. Telephone bidders are welcome, but please call us to arrange first. Online bidding is available at invaluable.com. And of course you can join us live on the floor as a bidder at the auction venue.
